Simple Past Tense

Affirmative = Subject + Verb in the past

Negative = Subject + DIDN'T + Verb in the infinitive

Interrogative = DID + Subject + Verb in the infinitive

Ex. 1 (REGULAR VERBS)

She cooked dinner yesterday.

She didn't cook dinner yesterday.

Did she cook dinner yesterday?

Ex. 1 (IRREGULAR VERBS)

She went to the beach last month.

She didn't go to the beach last month.

Did she go to the beach last month?



The Past Simple with "be"

Positive with 'be'	Negative with 'be'	Negative Short Form
I was cold.	I was not sleepy.	I wasn't sleepy.
You were tired.	You were not on the bus.	You weren't on the bus.
He was in the garden.	He was not at school.	He wasn't at school.
He was late.	He was not ugly.	He wasn't ugly.
It was rainy.	It was not hot.	It wasn't hot.
We were on holiday.	We were not at work.	We weren't at work.
They were hungry.	They were not tired.	They weren't tired.

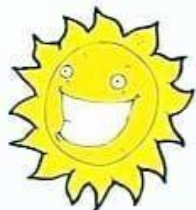
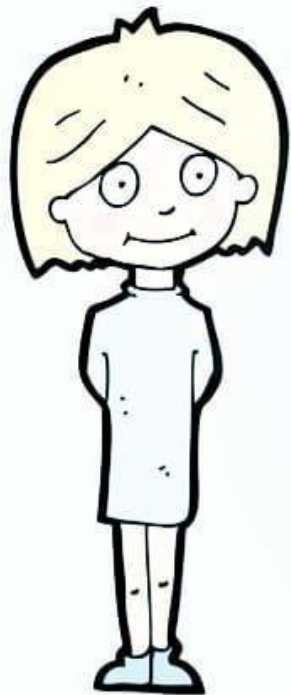

TIME EXPRESSIONS FOR THE PAST TENSE

LAST (=pasada)	AGO (=hace)	YESTERDAY (=ayer)
last night	10 minutes ago	yesterday
last week	an hour ago	Yesterday morning
last weekend	3 days ago	Yesterday afternoon
last month	a week ago	Yesterday evening
last year	a month ago	The day before yesterday
last Monday...	a year ago...	Yesterday night

Ex. I played basket yesterday afternoon

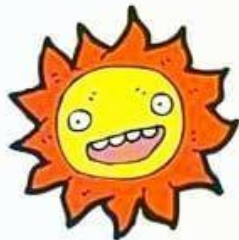

SHORT ADJECTIVES (1 SYLLABLE)	small	Smaller (than)	The smallest
	short	Shorter (than)	The shortest
	fat	Fatter (than)	The fattest
2 syllable adjective ending in -y	easy	Easier (than)	The easiest
	dirty	Dirtier (than)	The dirtiest
Long adjectives	difficult	More difficult	The most difficult
	beautiful	More beautiful	The most beautiful
Irregular	bad	Worse (than)	The worst
	good	Better (than)	The best
